Ending CEFM - A Canadian Priority

15 million girls are married every year before age 18

- CEFM hindered advancement of the Millennium Development Goals: #1 through #6
- Negative health outcomes (early pregnancy, increased risk of HIV, etc.)
- Socio-economic consequences for the community
- Increased risk of violence
- End to education
- Poverty



Canada's Approach

Ending CEFM will contribute to building **more developed, just and prosperous societies** around the world.

- Human rights and development challenge: must be addressed from both perspectives (multi-sectoral).
- Partnership: we all have a role to play in ending CEFM.
- Global issue and the leadership of highprevalence countries is essential for success.
- Multiple levels: requires interventions at global, regional, national and community/grassroots levels.
